Housing and Meal Costs for Children

Children aged 2 and under:

There is no added cost for the housing and meals of children ages 2 and under. It is assumed that young children will be housed in the parents' dorm room. If you wish to rent an additional room for your toddler, please see the pricing structure below.

Children ages 3 and up:

Housing

- Families with children ages 3 and up will be assigned at least 1 additional room at a cost of \$150 per month.
- A \$100 room deposit (refundable at the end of enrollment) is required for each additional room.
- Parents may house more than one child per room, but no more than current City of Bloomington rental housing standards allow by law (typically 2 per room, based on the size of rooms in most of our dorms)
- If you need more rooms due to the size of your family or if you would like to rent an additional room for study etc, please contact the Housing Coordinator about room availability in the dorms. Extra rooms for these purposes also cost an additional \$150 per month and are subject to a \$100 room deposit.

Meals

- Children ages 3-10 are charged \$90/month per child
- Children 11-18 are charged \$150/month per child

Making Payments

Students are invoiced approximately one month prior to the start of each semester and are expected to pay for the semester in its entirety by the first day of class for that semester. Annual fees are included on the first invoice of each school year.

Two other payment plan options are available upon request:

- 1) **Pay in advance** – pay for the entire year at once and receive a \$200 discount off the total cost. Payment is due by the first day of class of the first semester of the school year.
- 2) **Pay quarterly** – make your first payment for ½ of the total due for that semester plus a \$50 service fee; payment for the second ½ of the semester plus a \$50 service fee is due at the approximate halfway point of that semester.

The quarterly payment plan can be changed to the regular semester billing for the second semester if desired. Likewise, students who pay for the first semester in full can switch to the quarterly payment plan for the second semester if desired.

Methods of Payment

All fees may be paid using any of these methods:

- Credit Card
- Cash or personal check from a U.S. bank
- Cashier's check or U.S. Bank Draft drawn from a U.S. bank or payable through a major U.S. bank (most major banks in foreign countries will be able to sell cashier's checks payable through a U.S. bank; there is a fee from the bank for this service)
- U.S. Dollar Money Orders
- Wire transfer of funds in U.S. dollars (instructions available upon request); there is a fee from the sending bank and the receiving bank for this service – **this method is only available to international students or Americans living outside the US.**

Please write the name of the accepted student on all college fee payments.

IMPORTANT!

All fees must be paid in U.S. dollars only. We are unable to process payments made with foreign currencies or payments with unofficial indications of exchange to U.S. dollars (e.g. a handwritten note on a check indicating that the check was cut in U.S. dollars).

B.A. Degree Global Internship Costs

Students participating in the internship program for either the BA or AA degree must be accepted as missionaries under Bethany International Ministries (BIM). As such they raise support for their field ministry costs such as housing, food, ministry expenses, airfare, insurance, visa costs, etc. **The funds raised are considered a donation to Bethany International Ministries and the donor is provided a tax-deductable receipt.** Students accepted into Global Internship mission service are given guidance on how to raise funds and communicate with donors as part of the program. All expenses below are eligible to be raised via missionary support with the exception of the BCOM Program Fee.

- (1) Setup includes airfare, medical insurance, housing and furnishings and 1st month support.
- (2) Actual costs vary by internship location and local and international economic fluctuations at the time of the internship.
- (3) Ministry Funds are contributions received to donors by Bethany International and are tax-deductible
- (4) BCOM GI Program Fee costs are for educational training and are not tax-deductible; the amount varies depending on whether both spouses are students or not.

Senior Semester Costs (BA Students only)

Seniors returning from the Global Internship spend one final semester on campus, prior to graduation. They pay the same room and board rates as freshmen and sophomores enrolled during that semester. Global Internship seniors are granted a 100% tuition scholarship for their final semester.

A.A. Degree Missions Practicum Costs

Students in the Associates Degree program are required to meet a missions practicum requirement consisting of two 3- week mission trips organized by Bethany's short term missions division, STEM (Short Term Evangelical Missions). Trips take place in current or prospective BA Global Internship sites and are offered at various times of the year, including over summer breaks. Costs vary depending on the trips chosen, but average around \$6,000 per trip.
